



## Project overview

Whitehead Building Services was chosen as the preferred supplier ahead of a number of other companies to deliver an extremely high profile contract worth £500k for electrical work completed on the flagship Ryder Cup 2010 clubhouse at the Celtic Manor in Newport.

## Challenges

Whitehead Building Services was instructed to complete a full electrical installation within the clubhouse. The building's unique architecture included certain design features which posed a number of challenges for Whitehead; not least of these was the sizeable long hall pitched ceiling, built entirely from solid wood beams, which made it very difficult to conceal electrical wiring.

## Solutions

Project Manager Nick Olsen was placed in charge of the contract delivery and was responsible for onsite coordination and management throughout the duration of the project. Sensitive to the client's needs, Whitehead Building Services worked hard to ensure that the work was completed with a minimum amount of disruption to the day to day running of the clubhouse. All work was completed to the high standards enjoyed by a 5\* resort 430 bedroom hotel and leisure club.

## Result

Managed by Nick Olsen, the project work was completed within the given timescale and to an extremely high standard by Whitehead Building Services. Whitehead successfully devised a method of concealing all of the electrical wiring within the clubhouse's solid wood beams and carried out full installation of the building's fire alarms, CCTV, electrics, and complete data communications, including internet access and cash tills.
